## ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR...



Hailing from Lincoln, Nebraska, Liz Love is an active classical and jazz saxophonist and music educator in the Austin, Texas area. She is currently in her fifth year as Head Band Director at Grisham Middle School, teaching beginning flute, oboe, bassoon, clarinet, saxophone, as well as the Honors Band. She assists with the beginning brass classes and Symphonic Band. Previous to her time at Grisham, she was the Assistant Band Director at Running Brushy Middle School in Leander ISD, where she founded the RBMS Jazz Band in 2013. Her ensembles consistently receive UIL Sweepstakes ratings, and her students have earned Outstanding Soloist honors at Austin area jazz festivals. In 2019, the Grisham Middle School Honors Band was selected to perform at The Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic!

Ms. Love is a founding member of the Austin Saxophone Ensemble, which is in its fourth season and released its debut album in Spring of 2017. She also founded ASE Youth, a city-wide youth saxophone ensemble comprised of the most talented middle and high school saxophonists from all over the Austin area. An active clinician and adjudicator around the state, Ms. Love is a member of the Texas Music Educators Association and the Texas Bandmasters Association. She also serves as the TMEA Region 26 Middle School Band Chair, as well as the Region 26 TBA representative.

Ms. Love received her Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and her Master's Degree in Saxophone Performance from the University of Texas at Austin. ## ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR...



Albert Nguyen is the Director of Bands and Head of the Conducting Area at the University of Memphis. He holds the First Tennessee Professorship for his contribution to the University's educational, research, outreach, and service missions. His responsibilities include overseeing all aspects of the University Bands program, conducting the Wind Ensemble, leading the Graduate Wind Conducting program, and serving as the Director of the University of Memphis Summer at the Scheidt Program. Ensembles under Dr. Nguyen's direction have performed at the CBDNA Southern Regional Conference, the TNMEA All-State Conference, and Internationally in Austria and Italy. As a conductor and clinician, he has worked with ensembles and students throughout the United States, including the Mid-South as well as California, Florida, New York, North

Dakota, South Carolina, and Texas.

Dr. Nguyen began his professional teaching career as the Director of Bands at Morrilton High School in Morrilton, AR. He holds the Bachelor of Arts Degree in Music Education from Arkansas Tech University and the Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts in wind conducting from The University of Texas at Austin. Dr. Nguyen is a member of Kappa Kappa, Psi, Tau Beta Sigma, and serves the College Band Directors National Association as a member of its Diversity Committee.

## ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR ...



John Lynch is a leading international wind band conductor and a dual citizen of the United States and Australia. He is currently the interim Director of Bands at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point and a freelance conductor/composer/teacher based in Madison, Wisconsin. He was formerly the Director of Bands and Wind Symphony Conductor at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music where he created the first graduate degrees in wind conducting and the first comprehensive university band program in Australian history. He is the founder and artistic director of the Verbrugghen Ensemble, the Conservatorium's chamber orchestra in residence, and was previously Director of Bands and Professor of Music at the University of Georgia and the University of Kansas. Other positions include those at Northwestern University and Emory University. He was the conductor of Chicago's renowned Northshore Concert Band and the Atlanta Youth Wind Symphony and is the founder of the Greater New York

Wind Symphony and the University of Kansas/Kansas City Youth Wind Symphony. He has performed throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, South America, Asia, and Australia including the national conferences of the College Band Directors National Association, American Bandmasters Association, National Association for Music Education, Australian National Band and Orchestra Conference, the Midwest Clinic, World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles, as well as at Interlochen, Barcelona's Grec Festival, and invited tours of Ireland, Spain, China, Argentina, and Europe.

Lynch has three professional recordings on the Naxos label including the premiere in the Wind Band Classics Series, and one on the Klavier label. He is a published composer through C. Alan Music and Maestro and Fox. Awards include The American Prize, the national Stanbury Award for outstanding conducting and teaching, New York's Big Apple Corps National Leadership in the Arts award, The University of Georgia Creative Research Medal, a Northwestern University Searle Fellow for Teaching Excellence, elected membership in the American Bandmasters Association and Phi Beta Mu international band honor fraternity, and was nominated for Performance of the Year in the Australian Arts Music Awards. An advocate for diversity in music, he serves on the boards of several think tanks including the Institute for Composer Diversity and is one of the featured conductors in "The Horizon Leads Forward." John Lynch is a passionate advocate for new music and has commissioned, recorded, and premiered works from around the globe by both today's leading composers and those new to writing for the wind band medium. He holds degrees from Indiana University, the Eastman School of Music and the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music.

## **TOM FINIGAN**

Tom Finigan is the Director of Bands for the Colleton County High School Band of Blue and coordinator of the Instrumental Music Program for the Colleton County Schools. He is a native of Walterboro, SC and is in his thirty-fifth year with the Colleton County Band Program. Mr. Finigan has been associated with The Band of Blue either as a student, staff member, director, and a parent since 1976. He holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of South Carolina and a Master of Education degree in school administration and supervision from the Citadel.

His professional affiliations include National Association for Music Educators, National Band Association, Phi Beta Mu Honorary Band Masters Fraternity, Kappa Kappa Psi, Kappa Delta Epsilon, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, South Carolina Music Educators Association, and the South Carolina Band Directors Association.

The Band of Blue under Finigan's leadership has continued a tradition of excellence in our state. The Band of Blue has continued to perform engaging and innovative half time shows and has been named a top twelve finalist at the state marching Championships. The Colleton County High School Band has been awarded the Outstanding Performance Award nine times and has received Superior Ratings in Class III, IV and V at concert festival. The Band of Blue was a featured performer in the 2008 and 2019 Cherry Blossom Festival Parade in Washington, DC. and has performed in the 2010, 2013, and 2017 Krewe of Endyminion Parades in the Mardi Gras in New Orleans, LA.

During Mr. Finigan's tenure as Director of Middle School Bands, The Walterboro Junior Band and The Colleton County Junior Band received the Outstanding Performance Award from the South Carolina Band Directors Association sixteen years consecutively and a total of eighteen times out of nineteen years. Finigan served as an assistant director for Bill Young at Walterboro High School and Colleton County High School. From 1986-2005, the Band of Blue experienced a huge growth in the instrumental band program at the middle school and high school. Finigan along with Joe and Cathy Meshach served as assistant band directors when The Band of Blue won the 4A SCBDA State Marching Band Championships in 1986, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1995 and 1997. The Band of Blue also performed in the 1994 Tournament of Roses Parade and the 2000 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade. Bill Young was Director of the Band of Blue from 1973-2005.

Mr. Finigan is the past president of South Carolina Band Directors Association from 2003 to 2005. He served on the SCBDA Executive Board for the past 28 years. He also served as the SCBDA State Marching Committee Chairman for eight years and is currently serving as the SCBDA and South Carolina Music Educators Association Historian. He is also active as an adjudicator, clinician, and visual designer, having written for many fine area bands.
